Report on Impending Cyclone over Bay of Bengal

Dt. 25.05.2021

Time -5.00PM

Status of Cyclone (IMD Forecast):

Yesterday's cyclonic storm "YAAS" over east central BoB moved northnorthwest wards and intensified into a severe cyclonic storm in the same midnight (2330 hrs IST of 24th May).Further moving north-northwest wards, it lay centred at 0830 hrs IST of today, the 25th May, 2021 over West central and adjoining East central & north Bay of Bengal near latitude 18.3°Nand longitude 88.3°E, about 280 km south-southeast of Paradip (Odisha), 380 km south-southeast of Balasore (Odisha), 370 km south-southeast of Digha (West Bengal) and 370 kms southsouthwest of Sagar Islands (West Bengal).

It is very likely to move north-northwest wards, intensify further into a Very Severe Cyclonic Storm during next 12 hours. It would continue to move northnorthwest wards, intensify further and reach Northwest Bay of Bengal near north Odisha coast very close to Chandbali-Dhamra port by the early morning of Wednesday, the 26th May.

It is very likely to cross north Odisha-West Bengal coasts between Paradip and Sagar Island close to north of Dhamra and south of Balasore, during noon of Wednesday, the 26th May as a Very Severe Cyclonic Storm.

Wind warning:

Gale winds speed reaching 100-110 kmph gusting to 120 kmph is prevailing over major parts of central Bay of Bengal and adjoining north Bay of Bengal and would increase gradually becoming 125-135 gusting to 140 kmph from today evening.

Squally wind speed reaching 55-65 kmph gusting 75 kmph is prevailing over North Bayof Bengal and along and off north Andhra Pradesh-Odisha–West Bengal– Bangladesh coasts. It would further increase becoming 65-75 kmph gusting to 85 kmph over northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off north Odisha and adjoining West Bengal coasts including Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara, Puri, Bhadrak, Balasore of Odisha and east Medinipur, south 24 Parganas, Kolkata districts of West Bengal from 25th May evening.

Squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting 60 kmph would prevail over Ganjam,Khurda, Cuttack, Jajpur & Mayurbhanj Districts of Odisha and Howrah, Hooghly, north 24Parganas Districts of West Bengal from 25th evening.

It would further increase becoming gale wind speed 155-165 kmph gusting to 185 kmphover northwest Bay of Bengal and along & off north Odisha and adjoining West Bengalcoasts including Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara, Bhadrak, from early morning of 26th May and will extend to Balasore district of Odisha from the forenoon of 26th May, 120-130kmph gusting to 145 kmph over Mayurbhanj district of Odisha from early morning of 26th May.

Gale wind speed reaching 80-90 kmph gusting to 100 kmph would prevail over Puri, Cuttack, Khurda, Jajpur and Nayagarh districts of Odisha during same period. Thewind speed reaching 60-80 kmph gusting to 90 kmph would prevail along and off Ganjam and remaining interior districts of north Odisha.

Storm surge warning.

Tidal waves of height 2-4 meters above astronomical tide are likely to inundate low lying low laying areas of Medinipur, Balasore, Bhadrak and about 2 meters above astronomical tide are likely to inundate low lying low laying areas of South 24 Parganas, Kendrapara & Jagatsinghpur Districts around the time of landfall.

Dissemination of IMD warnings & Bulletins:

• IMD weather Bulletins & cyclone warnings are being disseminated to Collectors, Departments and stake holders at regular intervals.

Preparatory Action Taken:

Functioning of Control Room:

• State and District Emergency Operation Centre and Control Rooms of other offices are functioning round the clock in three shifts with a senior officer in charge of each shift.

Identification of Shelters:

- Facility verification check has been conducted in all the Multi Purpose Cyclone and flood shelters in the coastal & adjoining districts.
- Large number of alternate shelters has been identified to accommodate evacuees observing COVID protocol. Three Govt. functionaries have been identified for each shelter to coordinate evacuation to their designated shelters.

Evacuation Plan:

- Evacuation Plan has been made for evacuation of people from the vulnerable locations. PRIs and WSHGs will be involved in evacuation and Shelter management.
- One 3 ply face mask to be provided to each evacuee to use it during the entire period of stay in the shelter.
- Collectors of coastal districts have been instructed to evacuate the vulnerable people / people living in kutcha houses and shift them to Multipurpose cyclone/ flood shelters and other safe shelters.

Free Kitchen Arrangements

• Cooked food through free kitchen, safe drinking water, lighting with alternate power supply, health & sanitation facilities have been arranged for evacuated people at the shelters.

Satellite Phones:

Satellite phones of all Collectors are in readiness for communication if telecommunication fails.

Arrangements for temporary shelter materials:

Arrangement for providing temporary shelter materials (polythene sheet) have been made for the households if houses will be damaged due to effect of cyclonic wind/ heavy rain.

Other Measures:

- Collectors have been instructed to make back-up power arrangement/ generators arrangements with adequate fuel at different utility services like Drinking water supply, petrol pumps, health institutions, telecom facilities, electrical grid/ sub stations, police stations and others.
- Adequate power back up/ stock of essential medicines/ food stuff arranged in all hospitals/Covid Care Centres/ Cluster TMCs/ TMCs.
- Inventory of search and rescue equipment have been done by the concerned district administration.
- Collectors have been instructed for alternate arrangement of drinking water during and aftermath of the cyclone.
- All the telephone service providers have been asked to keep their manpower and equipment in readiness for quick restoration of the telephone lines.
- Go-NGO coordination meeting has been taken at district level.

Preparatory Measures taken by Departments
